Attendance

Members are expected to attend every rehearsal. Each musician's presence is important to the experience of the entire orchestra. However, conflicts occasionally arise. If you need to perform in a school concert at the same time as an SYSA rehearsal, the school music event has priority.

In addition, you may verbally notify your conductor. It is important to notify us *in advance* about any absence so that the conductors can plan accordingly.

If a musician misses more than two rehearsals during one semester, he/she needs to meet with the conductor (participation in the concert is at the discretion of the conductor). Music for the concerts is prepared in just eleven or twelve regular rehearsals. Five important sectionals with professional coaches contribute to each musician's technique as well as the group performance.

Conduct

- Arrive about 10 minutes early so that you are in your seat with all necessary equipment (including pencils), warmed up, and ready to play at the start of the rehearsal.
- Come to rehearsals musically prepared.
- Conduct yourself in a respectful manner toward the conductor and fellow musicians.
- Do not eat, drink, or chew gum during rehearsals or concerts.
- Remain in designated areas during breaks.
- Understand the Attendance requirements.
 Failure to follow the policies may be grounds for dismissal without refund of tuition.

Tuition for 2017-2018

Tuition can be paid in full in the fall (preferred) or in two or four installments.

Limited tuition assistance is available. The application is on our website (due October 16, 2017).

Volunteer requirement

In order to keep tuition as low as possible, we rely on volunteers to help with many aspects of our program. We ask each family to provide at least two hours of volunteer work per musician per year. Some of our parents serve many more hours each year. Alternatively, you can donate \$50 per musician (tax deductible). Thank you for your help in providing an excellent orchestral experience for our musicians!

You can either sign the Log Book binder or use the online Log Book on our website to record your volunteer time. The purpose of the Log Book is a record for potential grants. Thank you!

Photos/Videos

Salem Youth Symphony often takes photos and videos for promotional use. Videos of the concerts are usually available for sale.

Emergency contact

Concert clothes

Mozart Players & Amadeus Players

Girls: White top with 3/4 length or longer sleeves. Black pants or skirt that covers the knees when seated. Black closed-toe shoes.

Boys: White long sleeve, button-down shirt. Black bow tie. Black pants. Black closed-toe shoes, black socks.

Philharmonia & Youth Symphony

Girls: Head to toe black outfit. No sleeveless. If wearing a skirt or dress, it should cover the knees when seated. Black closed-toe shoes.

Boys: White long sleeve, button-down shirt. Black bow tie. Black pants. Black closed-toe shoes, black socks. Black vest or jacket optional.
