THIS PIECE WAS INSPIRED by the melodies, harmonies, and style of Hungarian folk dances.

## LITTLE SYMPHONY

CAROLD NUNEZ (1929–2015)

HIS LIVELY PIECE was composed in the style of Mozart, although the composer's own personality does shine through.

## LION CITY

SOON HEE NEWBOLD (B. 1974)

XPERIENCE THE DIVERSE cultures of Singapore (Lion City) in a whirlwind of sonorities! This piece combines rhythmic intensity and soaring themes along with special effects sounds that imitate authentic instruments such as the ehru, pipa, and gamelan.



### PALLADIO

KARL JENKINS (B. 1944) ARR. ROBERT LONGFIELD

LTHOUGH THIS PIECE sounds like it came straight out of the Baroque period, it is actually the first movement of a suite written in 1996 by Karl Jenkins. This piece is rhythmic and dramatic with its relentless pulse. The main tune is often recognized as the famous "diamond commercial" theme.

### Warrior Legacy

SOON HEE NEWBOLD (B. 1974)

TARRIOR LEGACY was commissioned in honor of the Acushnet Classic Ensemble, a youth orchestra in Fairhaven, Massachusetts. The composer wrote about her inspiration for the piece: "Fairhaven, like the rest of Massachusetts, is rich in history and home to many prominent historical figures. Located on the south coast, English settlers from the Plymouth Colony purchased the land in 1670. Sea battles and invasions took place near Fort Phoenix in Fairhaven during the Revolutionary War and 1812. Whaling was also a huge part of the culture and influenced Herman Melville, the author of Moby Dick, who left from Fairhaven on a whaling ship called the Acushnet in the 1840s. Warrior Legacy commemorates the rich past events that have not only helped shape our country, but also continue to influence the pioneers of the future."

## RHOSYMEDRE: PRELUDE ON A WELSH HYMN TUNE

Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872–1958)

N 1920 RALPH VAUGHAN WILLIAMS composed Three Preludes on Welsh Hymn Tunes for organ, which quickly became established as standard repertoire for the instrument. Of the three, Rhosymedre (sometimes known as "Lovely") has become the most popular. The original hymn tune was written by the 19th-century Welsh composer J. D. Edwards. It is a simple melody. Yet, around this modest tune, Vaughan Williams constructed a piece of grand proportions.

Arnold Foster, a student of Vaughan Williams, orchestrated *Rhosymedre* so that the rise of the long line of the hymn tune is enhanced by an increasing number of instruments.

### Andalucia Suite


ERNESTO LECUONA (1896-1963) ARR. GORDON JENKINS

RNESTO LECUONA was a Cuban-American Composer and virtuoso pianist. The *Andalucia* Suite was composed for piano in 1928. Gordon Jenkins's orchestration of the piano suite is an arrangement of the main themes in six movements without a break rather than a literal transcription. Throughout the composition a musical portrait of Andalucia (a picturesque region of southern Spain) is depicted. The movements to be performed today without a break include Córdoba, Andaluza, Alhambra, and Malagueña.

## "Marche militaire française" FROM SUITE ALGÉRIENNE, OP. 60

Camille Saint-Saëns (1835–1921)

ARCHE MILITAIRE FRANÇAISE," written **V** in 1880, is the final movement of the *Algerian* Suite by the French Romantic composer Camille Saint-Saëns. The composer was inspired by several trips he made to Algeria, the North African country then ruled by France. He wrote this lively march in honor of the French army garrisoned there.

## Fanfare from *La Péri*

Paul Dukas (1865 –1935)

AUL DUKAS was a French composer and prominent music critic. He was famously self-critical and destroyed most of his compositions. He allowed only 15 of his works to be published. His best-known piece, The Sorcerer's Apprentice, is used for the enchanted broom scene in Disney's Fantasia. He also published one ballet score, La Péri. The energetic fanfare was added to the ballet a year after publication to give the typically noisy audience time to settle into their seats before the ballet began. The fanfare uses the orchestra's brass section.

## OVERTURE TO POET AND PEASANT

Franz von Suppé (1819–1895)

T'S POSSIBLE you have never heard of the composer Franz von Suppé. However, you may have heard his music in various animated cartoons. Popeye the Sailor Man conducts the overture to *Poet and Peasant* in the appropriately renamed "Spinach Overture." Mickey Mouse conducts an orchestral performance of the overture with barnyard animals in "The Barnyard Concert."

Franz von Suppé wrote Poet and Peasant in 1846 as incidental music to accompany a production that he called a "comedy with song." After his death it was made into an operetta in three acts. Like most of his work, the operetta itself is rarely performed although the overture has become a classic at pops concerts.

The overture opens with a solemn chorale by the brass followed by a lyrical cello solo. The orchestra finishes with a fiery section that dissolves into a waltz, finishing with a boisterous, syncopated cancan.



### PIANO CONCERTO IN C-SHARP MINOR

Francis Poulenc (1899–1963)

PRANCIS POULENC was a highly accomplished French pianist and composer. He composed much of his work at the piano and wrote many pieces for the instrument throughout his career. His compositions also include songs, chamber music, choral pieces, operas, ballets, and orchestral concert music. Poulenc's Piano Concerto in C-sharp Minor was the last of his five concertos. It was commissioned by the Boston Symphony Orchestra to restore relations between Paris and the United States after the Second World War and was performed with the composer at the piano on January 6, 1950.

## Symphony No. 5 in C Minor, op. 67

Ludwig van Beethoven (1770–1827)

CYMPHONY No. 5 by Ludwig van Beethoven is one Of the best-known and most popular pieces in all of classical music. The symphony was composed in 1808 when he was in his thirties and already losing his hearing. The first movement begins with the well-known fournote motif (short-short-long). Beethoven allegedly remarked to his assistant that this represents "fate knocking at the door." Although it's doubtful that this story is true, the description has stuck. The four-note "fate" motif is repeated numerous times, sometimes sounding ominous and sometimes triumphant, and it is passed from one section of the orchestra to another. The fourth movement, the symphony's grand finale, is triumphant and joyful.

## JON HARRIS-CLIPPINGER

Musical Director and Conductor OF SALEM YOUTH SYMPHONY

ON HARRIS-CLIPPINGER HAS BEEN with the Salem Youth Symphony organization for over 20 years. He currently conducts the Youth Symphony Orchestra, the premier ensemble, and serves as music director of the Salem Youth Symphony Association. He received his Bachelor of Music Education from Willamette University where he studied conducting under Bruce McIntosh, Martin Behnke, and Wallace Long. He received his Master of Music Education from the University of Illinois where he studied conducting under Donald Schleicher, Deborah Sheldon, and Kathleen Horvath.

Jon has taught orchestra in Salem-Keizer for over 20 years and currently works in the South Salem High School orchestra program at Leslie and Howard Street Charter School. In 2003, Jon was a guest conductor with the South Salem High School Chamber Orchestra at the prestigious Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic. He has fostered collaborations between the Newport Youth Symphony at the Oregon Coast (NYSOC), Central Oregon Youth Symphony (COYS), and Salem Youth Symphony. Members of the organizations have inspired elementary students by producing children's concerts at the Performing Arts Center in Newport and in the Bend-La Pine school district. Jon developed the masterclass series connecting SYS musicians with world-renowned teachers and artists from Juilliard, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and beyond.

Jon is the executive director of Summer Strings, an orchestra camp he founded in 1999 that serves 200 area string students. He remains an active member of the National Association for Music Education (NAfME),

the Oregon Music Education Association (OMEA), and the American String Teachers Association (ASTA). Jon has been a guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinician for the Washington State University Orchestra Festival. He has adjudicated events for the Evergreen School District Solo and Ensemble Festival, MTNA String Solo Competition, and the Oregon Cello Society. He has privately taught several award-winning cellists. Jon received his inspiration for working with youth orchestras as a member of the Portland Youth Philharmonic (PYP) from 1987–1994 where he toured Europe and Asia under the direction of Jacob Avshalomov. Jon enjoys living in Salem with his wife, Jennifer, and their children, Caden and Emma, who both play in Youth Symphony.

#### Danny Hunt

CONDUCTOR OF PHILHARMONIA

ANNY HUNT IS DIRECTOR of bands at Claggett Creek Middle School in Keizer and has taught middle school band for over 25 years. He is a graduate of the University of Oregon, where he received both bachelor's and master's degrees in music education. He feels honored to be able to teach in the Salem-Keizer school district, which he believes provides incredible support for music education and has one of the finest comprehensive music programs in the country. He values his many colleagues in the district for their expertise, passion, and willingness to collaborate. He is so thankful to have the special opportunity to conduct Philharmonia, as both his daughter Natalie and son Nicholas have been members of Salem Youth Symphony orchestras. PHILHARMONIA STRING TECHNIQUE ADVISOR

IM CHARNHOLM, A NATIVE of Salem, Oregon, and graduate of Sprague High School, knew from an early age that music would play a large part in his life. He graduated from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, with a bachelor's degree in education and violin performance. He taught in Illinois for four years while completing a master's degree in music education at Illinois State University.

Jim moved back to Oregon in 2002; he is proud to have been a part of further developing the tradition of musical excellence at McKay High School. During his seventeen-year tenure at McKay High School, a symphony was added in 2016 and the McKay Chamber Orchestra consistently placed in the top ten at the OSAA String Orchestra Festival, including three fifth place and one third place awards.

In 2019 the Oregon Symphony Association in Salem honored him with its award for Outstanding Music Educator of the Year. He serves on the board of the Oregon Coast Youth Symphony Festival based in Newport, Oregon, that provides a four-day festival for public school orchestra programs free of charge. Jim runs a family business with his wife of 20 years, Anne Marie. They have two daughters, Amy and Megan. Jim enjoys hiking, sailing, and spending time with his family during his free time.

### ALEXANDER FIGUEROA

CONDUCTOR OF AMADEUS PLAYERS

LEX FIGUEROA IS CURRENTLY the orchestra director at McKay High School, which currently offers four string orchestras and a full symphony orchestra. Alex earned a Bachelor of Music Education from Ohio State University where he studied string pedagogy with Robert Gillespie and conducting with David Becker, Scott A. Jones, and Miriam Burns.

Alex has worked with the Columbus Symphony Junior Strings, Chamber Strings, Cadet Orchestra, and Youth Orchestra as both a sectional coach and conductor. Alex was a member of the Central Ohio Symphony from 2018–2020. When Alex is not teaching or performing, he enjoys cooking, traveling, hiking, and skiing.

#### LAUREN SCOTTON

CONDUCTOR OF MOZART PLAYERS

AUREN SCOTTON EARNED a Master of Music Lin Music Education and a Master of Music in Viola Performance and String Pedagogy at the University of Oregon. During her graduate studies she was the recipient of the Eugene Symphony Orchestra Graduate Teaching Fellowship. She was a section member of the Eugene Symphony Orchestra for three seasons.

Prior to her graduate studies she graduated from St. Olaf College with a Bachelor of Arts in Music on Viola with a Concentration in Management Studies and was a member of the nationally and internationally recognized St. Olaf Orchestra. During her undergraduate studies she spent the spring semester of 2014 in Milan, Italy, studying viola with Mauro Righnini and had an assistantship with the Milano Classica Orchestra performing on both modern and baroque viola. In the summer of 2016, she received Britt Festival Orchestra's viola fellowship. During this fellowship she performed alongside members of the Britt Orchestra under the baton of Music Director Teddy Abrams, was mentored by professional orchestral musicians, and programed and performed several outreach concerts in a string quartet with other fellows.

Lauren returned to Salem to teach orchestra at Crossler Middle School after teaching in Washington at the high school and middle school levels. When Lauren is not teaching or playing her viola, she enjoys going on runs with her husband, cooking and baking, and spending time with family and friends.






